How can we help you?

The National Gallery of Jamaica's Education Department is the public outreach arm of the institution. We cater to the information needs of all our clients and visitors - young and old, local and foreign.

As such, it is our desire to provide and innovate the best quality service options for you in keeping with the National Gallery's mandate to "... promote our artistic heritage for future and present generations".



Research Assistance

The Education Department can provide consultations for a wide range of visual art related research topics and questions. We facilitate public access to reference material such as books, magazines, exhibition catalogues, artists' files and photographs. Requests for images can be facilitated through the printing of black/white and coloured photocopies.

Tour Services

Visitors have the option of requesting a guided tour which provides insightful contextual perspectives on the displayed artworks and the gallery's operations. Guided tours are available during all opening hours and are typically booked at least one (1) week in advance of the tour date via phone or email. Main guided tour formats include:

- Historical - an exploration of Jamaican social history and culture through the lens of artworks produced in Jamaica.
- Forms of Art - presentation on various art forms showcased in our collections, focusing on processes, technology and materials utilized by Jamaican artists.
- 10 to 15 minute introductions are also booked in advance, free of charge.



Outreach Programmes

The Education Department also facilitates outreach sessions as a way to encourage visitorship as well as to provide educational services to groups that may have challenges visiting the museum.

Child Art Programmes

The Education Department coordinates specialized programmes for children between ages 5 to 17 years old. These include special activity-based guided tours for young children, Saturday child art workshops (age range 8 to 15 years old) as well as Last Sunday children's tours. The Education Department also invites proposals from various groups interested in having the NGJ collaborate with them for summer programmes.



Public Forums & Seminars

The Education Department coordinates public and specialized workshops and seminars to discuss or address various topics associated with the visual arts and culture. The department also coordinates educational programming to accompany exhibitions held at the NGJ such as artists' talks.
